Dear Parent/s Please note the following:

15th Anniversary Draw Halloween Holidays: Many thanks for your generosity towards our 15th Anniversary Draw. A total sum of £4599.25 and 46 Euro was raised via the Grand Draw and Cake Sale. This money will now go towards new resources for Numeracy and ICT.

Christmas Shoe Boxes: The families of children in P4 and P7 (one box per family) are asked to fill a shoe box that will be sent to children in Belarus. Each shoe box should be wrapped in Christmas Paper with a <u>£2.00</u> taped to the outside. Wrap lid and box separately and use an elastic band to attach the lid to the box. Age groups are 5-8yrs, 9-12yrs and 13-16yrs and items to include are small toys, games, cuddly toys, stationery, toiletries, confectionery, scarf, gloves, hat and small Christmas Card with child's first name only. Label box for age group and gender. All items should be new. This may be the only Christmas Presents these children receive. All shoe boxes should be brought into school by Thursday 25th October 2018.

NSPCC Assembly: The NSPCC will visit our school on Thursday 25th October 2018 and deliver an Assembly to all children in P1-6 (See letter attached) with a special workshop for P7 only. A separate letter has been sent home with all P7 Children today.

On Friday 16th November 2018, as part of Anti Bullying Week, we will have a 'Wear a Red Day' to highlight Anti Bullying Week with money raised going to the NSPCC.

Family Fittness Club : A Family Fitness Club, will begin on Wednesday 7th November 2018 for 6 weeks for Children in P2-3 and their parents, from 2-3pm and for Children in P4-7 and their parents, from 3-4pm. The aim of the club will be to high light the importance of fitness for each family. The cost of the club will be met by our Extended School Funding. If you would like to take part in the club please reply to this email ASAP. I would encourage you to consider this programme for you and your child/ren. Maximum places is 12 children and 12 adults allocated on a first come basis.

P2 Trip – Build a Bear Belfast: The Primary 2 Class will visit 'Build a Bear' in Belfast on Thursday 15th November 2018. They will leave the school at 915am sharp and return for 2.00pm. Children should wear their uniform and bring a small morning snack and a packed lunch. The cost of the trip is £20.00. The cost of the bus will be met from school funds. Please return payment marked with your child's name/Build a Bear by Friday 9th November 2018.

P6 Trip: Primary 6 will visit the **Navan Centre** on Tuesday 20th November 2018 as part of their study on Vikings and Monks. The children will need a packed lunch and a warm coat. The cost of the trip will be met from school funds.

P3 Trip: Primary 3 will visit the **Museum** in Armagh on Tuesday 20th November 2018 as part of their study on Toys. The children will need a snack but will return in time for lunch. The cost of the trip will be met from school funds.

This is a nationwide programme for every primary-school-aged child in the UK and Channel Islands. With the help of their friendly mascot Buddy, they'll be presenting an assembly and workshop to the children in our school.

What is the Speak out. Stay safe. programme?

Through child-friendly, interactive assemblies and workshops their specially trained staff and volunteers will give our children information about how to keep themselves safe from harm and how to get help if they have any worries, sensitively discussing issues like bullying and sexual abuse, without using scary words or adult language.

We have studied the content of the materials and heard from other schools who have participated and are extremely confident that they are appropriate for primary-school-aged children. By the end of their visit, we're convinced children will feel empowered – knowing how they can speak out and stay safe.
